GENERAL STATEMENT

CELEBRATE 73 YEARS OF INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS DAY (10/12/1948-10/12/2021)



This day was chosen as December 10, 1948, the United Nations promulgated the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. On this day, Eleanor Roosevelt, former First Lady of the United States, read the historic Universal Declaration of Human Rights on behalf of the United Nations in Paris, France. This declaration forms the basis of the International Code of Human Rights, which includes two fundamental human rights conventions, both ratified by the United Nations in 1966, the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights

On December 4, 1950, during the 317th plenary session, the United Nations issued Resolution A/RES/423(V) officially recognizing December 10 every year as "Human Rights Day". In recent years, the United Nations has chosen a theme for Human Rights Day each year.

Human rights organizations such as Amnesty International see this day every year as an opportunity to look at the human rights situation around the world and draw conclusions about the current situation.

Every year on this day the European Parliament holds the Sakharov Prize ceremony, the organizations Reporters Without Borders present their Human Rights Awards.

Every year on December 10, which is also the day of Alfred Nobel's death, in Oslo (Norway) the Nobel Peace Prize awarding ceremony is held.

Right in 1982, Communist Vietnam voluntarily registered to become a member of important international conventions of the United Nations on human rights, including: Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948) Convention on human rights civil and political (1966); Convention on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (1966); Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against

Women (1979); Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination (1969).
Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment...
